- Possessing **desktop** or **laptop** with good internet connectivity is a **mandatory** requirement. Many tools may not work on Mobile phones or tablets.
- Only those who are willing to login from 3:00 to 5:30 PM and 6:30 to 9:00 PM everyday and are willing to work asynchronously extra for one hour everyday. The workshop is equivalent to HRDC's Full-time one-week FDP.
